AID & SERVICES OFFERED AT BRIDGERLAND

FEDERAL & STATE GRANTS

ZERO EFC TREATMENT (IRAQ & AFGHANISTAN SERVICE GRANT): Federal Pell Grant eligible students whose parent/guardian died as a result of US military service in Iraq or Afghanistan after 9/11/01 may receive increased amounts of federal aid if the student was less than 24 years old when the parent/guardian died, or enrolled at an institution of high education at the time of death. Following submission of the FAFSA the Dept. of Ed will notify the College when a student appears to meet the criteria and inform the student of his/her possible increase in eligibility.

SUCCESS STIPEND PROGRAM: State funded need-based financial aid program for Utah residents currently enrolled in an eligible College program. Recipients must be enrolled a minimum of 15 hours per week. This one-time stipend is offered to students with the greatest financial need as determined by the FAFSA. Eligible students will be notified.

INTERNAL & EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS
