

SIGN YOUR FAFSA!

By signing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) the applicant is assuming responsibility for the accuracy of the information reported. In addition to certifying that the data on the FAFSA are correct, the student is also signing a Statement of Educational Purpose, which is required to receive Federal Student Aid (FSA) funds. Among other things, the student agrees to spend FSA funds only on educational expenses and affirms that he or she is not in default on a federal loan or does not owe a grant overpayment. If the student is dependent, one parent whose information is reported on the FAFSA must also sign.

You (and/or your parent if you are dependent) did not sign the FAFSA on the Web or corrections you submitted OR a signature page for you (and/or your parent if you are dependent) has not been received. You (and your parent if you are dependent) must sign the FAFSA and any corrections you make before your eligibility for FSA (Pell Grant) may be determined.



Students and parents who have an FSA ID can electronically sign their FAFSA on the Web or corrections. Apply for a US Department of

Education FSA ID at www.fafsa.ed.gov by clicking on the FSA ID icon, and following the instructions to create an FSA ID now. This process may take 1-3 days. Alternately, students



Once you (and your parent if you are dependent) have signed the FAFSA on the Web or corrections a new student aid report will be sent to Bridgerland Technical College. You will be contacted by the College's Financial Aid Office approximately two weeks later.



If you need help signing your FAFSA call 1-800-4FED-AID (1-800-433-3243). Operators are available to assist you seven days a week between 8 am and midnight eastern time.
