Fire and Rescue Services & Financial Aid

Bridgerland Technical College offers the Federal Pell Grant for eligible students enrolled in the Fire and Rescue Services program. The Utah State Approving Agency for Veterans Education has approved Bridgerland's Fire and Rescue Services program for Veterans and other eligible persons. Scholarships may also be available. There are some really important things you need to be aware of regarding financial aid before you enroll. Carefully review the following. To qualify for financial aid for the 860-hour Fire and Rescue Services program, you must enroll in and successfully complete all courses within the Fire and Rescue Services program. This includes: Intro to Fire (60 hours), RCA (525 hour), College English (60-hours), College Math (75-hours), and Emergency Medical Technician (140-hours).

You may choose to complete the College Math, College English, or EMT courses before being accepted and enrolling in Fire and Rescue Services. If you choose to complete these courses before being accepted and enrolling in the Fire and Rescue Services program you must contact your instructor about having these hours reported to Registration as Transfer Hours.

You must complete (among other requirements) a Pre-Admission Math and English competency that is different from the College Math and College English required for the completion of Fire and Rescue Services.

Financial aid is not available for any courses completed prior to acceptance and enrollment in the Fire and Rescue Services program, or for any courses taken to meet admission requirements.
