

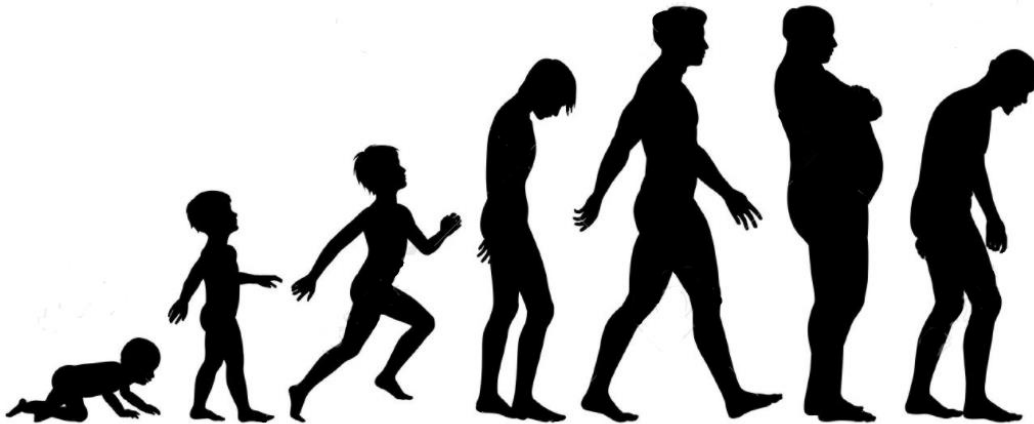


Lifetime Eligibility Unit (Pell LEU)

Students must fall within a Pell Lifetime Eligibility Unit (LEU) equivalent of 12 semesters. In other words students may only receive 600% of all scheduled Pell Grant awards. Twelve semester equivalency is calculated by adding the annual percentages of a student's scheduled award that was disbursed to the student. The total of the annual percentages is the student's lifetime eligibility used (LEU) limit. Once a student reaches 600%, the student is no longer eligible to receive the Federal Pell Grant. Students are liable for any Pell Grants exceeding the LEU they receive.

Based on information Bridgerland Technical College has received through the Central Processing System and the National Student Loan Data System (Comment Code 347) it has been determined that you have received a total amount of Federal Pell Grants that equals or exceeds the cumulative total you can receive. As a result you are not eligible to receive Pell Grant funds.

Scholarships or other sources of financial aid may be available to assist you as you continue your enrollment at Bridgerland. Visit the Financial Aid Office on-line for applications and information.



This requirement was effective with the 2012-2013 Pell award and replaced the 900% lifetime eligibility equivalent for first time Pell recipients that came into effect July 2006.
